A Note from Terry Snyder

I have read recently of churches in different cities, who seem to be experiencing a special move of God: Increased attendance, baptisms and so forth. How I pray that we experience a renewal personally, and the church sees people without the Lord (or who have forgotten Him) come to Him.

People tend to want to put God and the Holy Spirit (and Christians for that matter) in a box. We tend to think God and the Holy Spirit always work a certain way (often being what we are used to, or how we are most comfortable). I think about Christ healing the blind in the Bible. He didn't do it the same way. Was He doing what made the receiver comfortable, taking them out of their comfort zone because they needed it, or was He just refusing to be put in a box? Regardless, He did different things to get the same result.

Some churches feel people who do not speak in tongues are not filled with the Holy Spirit. I have yet to figure out where it states that Biblically as a requirement. Charles Stanley was interviewed once and said although He had never spoken in tongues, that he knew the Holy Spirit was in him.

Some think whooping and hollering, running the aisles, and so forth is the way Christians should be. I understand how God can touch a person in a way that they can't contain their joy. The danger lies in thinking those who do not have that experience are dead spiritually. But it is also dangerous to think that those who are doing so are faking it or behaving other than how a "good Christian" should behave in church. I would hate to have missed God's voice in not responding as He wants, or scolding or stopping someone else who was lead to do so in a certain way because it wasn't my way, made me uncomfortable, didn't fit the bulletin, or because I misjudged their motives.

Others think that sitting quietly and listening to the still small voice is the way the Holy Spirit works. (and sometimes He does.) There can be sweet moments where the Holy Spirit touches us in a way where we may weep, or feel God's presence trick-ling down our bodies.

I have seen some who think that planning a service is taking the life out, and doing our own thing. They feel that people should walk in unprepared, and let God move and direct right on the spot. While God can tell us during the service to do or say a particular thing., I have also seen times where the service was chaos because people didn't prepare. I don't see God planning chaos for a worship service. God can just as easily tell people what to do days (or weeks) before a service, and be in the planning, instead of waiting until the service and the last minute to direct us. (God may do so to make sure we are listening, or to see our willingness to walk away from our plans. That, or we missed His voice the first time).

On the opposite side, there have sadly been some who plan God out of a service. God may want to go a certain way, and people are too set in their planned order, comfort, traditions etc. to do what God is directing to do. They may have everything planned out to the second, and refuse to budge.

The way I have felt (even before being on staff) is to be open to however God directs us and others individually to worship. Want to whoop and holler? If it is sincere and not an attempt to make ourselves look holy (and God is the one who decides that, not us by how it may look), go for it. Want to raise your hands while you have tears in your eyes? The same answer. I hope that you all feel the freedom to worship however you feel directed, regardless of whether you are experiencing different than your neighbor or anyone else. I also don't want people to not listen to God because of "what people might think", embarrassment, wanting to stay safely in our comfort zones, etc.

As for the service, we try to plan to the best of our abilities and wisdom, hoping we are sensitive to God's voice, and pray we are heeding God's direction. There have been times at service (before slides during it all) that I felt led during the sermon to change the last song, and I did. My prayer is that we hear and heed God's voice while worshiping, planning, or leading service. **Help us not to be so set in our ways, or stuck in our comfort zones that we miss God, or a move of God.**
